Suzanne Mak has worked as a Nurse Specialist for over ten years and is currently a ward manager in the Department of Clinical Oncology in Prince of Wales Hospital. She has abundant experience and knowledge in a variety of aspects about radiation nursing, chemotherapy nursing, oncology haematology nursing. She has been involved in clinical work, management, education, training and research. Suzanne is the Member (Oncology Specialty Representative), Clinical Consultative Working Group, Hong Kong Academy of Nursing. She is the vice-chairperson of Nursing Research Subcommittee of New Territories East Cluster, Hospital Authority in Hong Kong.

She actively involved in various clinical projects to promote and implement evidence-based nursing practice. She has succeeded to obtain three full-grant HK Government research funds to study a variety of areas separately about the post-irradiation wound, the arm lymphedema and quality of life in Chinese breast cancer patients, and wound cleansing technique. These advances underpin her group's work in continuing the clinical research.
